RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All entries to be sent to:
 - a) Show secretaries, The Old Chapel, Cury TR12 7BG.
 - b) No later than 12 noon Friday 1st September 2017.
 - c) Entrance fee Junior Classes free all other classes 10p.
 - d) No late entries will be accepted on show day.**
2. Exhibitors may enter as many exhibits as they wish unless otherwise stated, but only the higher awards count for prize money or points.
3. Stewards cannot enter items in the section that they are stewarding.
4. All classes open to residents in Cornwall.
5. The committee reserve the right to refuse an entry.
6. Cards will be supplied by the Secretary from 8:00 am on the morning of the show for the placing of exhibits.
7. Every article must be staged by 9:45am and ready for judging by 10:00am. At which time the hall will be cleared of all persons not officially engaged.
8. All trays, dishes, plates, vases, boxes etc for exhibiting flowers, vegetables etc to be provided by the exhibitor.
9. All exhibits shall be the recent bona-fide property of the exhibitors having not been previously entered and shall be grown, cultivated, taken or made by the exhibitor except floral art and pot plant classes.
10. The committee will take ordinary care of exhibits but will not be responsible for loss or damage. Moving or re-arranging the exhibits must be carried out by or under the jurisdiction of the senior steward.
11. Judges may withhold prizes if the specimens are not worthy and in all cases their decision will be final. If the entries in any class do not exceed three the judges will be at liberty to withhold any prize. Objections must be lodged with the senior steward before the presentation of the cups. Judges should use their discretion when judging, remembering the entries may come from inexperienced exhibitors.
12. No exhibit must be removed from the hall until 5pm.
13. A comments book will be at the show and any comments should be registered and signed before presentation of the cups.
14. Prize money: 1st 25p, 2nd 20p, 3rd 15p unless otherwise stated. All prize money to be claimed on the day of the show.
15. Points awarded in all classes 1st 3 points 2nd 2 points 3rd 1 point.
16. All cups and trophies and shields to be returned to Andrew Stott, 2 Parcnoweth, Cury, Churchtown, TR12 7BW by 1st August 2018.

17. Any loss or damage to the cups, Mr Andrew Stott must be informed at once.

18. Small shields presented for best exhibit in each section do not need to be returned and may be kept.

GIVEN RECIPE DRIED FRUIT TEA LOAF

Use any combination of dried fruits. Makes one 23x23cm/9x5in loaf.

450g/1lb mixed dried fruit, such as currants, raisins, chopped dried apricots and dried/glace cherries.

300ml/ ½ pint of cold strong tea

200g/7oz dark brown sugar

Grated rind and juice of one small orange, Grated rind and juice of 1 lemon

1 egg lightly beaten

200g/7oz plain flour

15ml/ 1 tbsp baking powder

1.5ml/ ¼ tsp salt

Mix dried fruit with cold tea and leave to soak overnight. Preheat oven to 180C/350F/gas mark 4.

Line base and sides of loaf tin with greaseproof paper and grease the paper.

Strain the fruit, reserving the liquid. In a bowl, combine sugar, orange and lemon rind and fruit. Pour orange and lemon juice into the measuring jug. If the quantity is less than 250ml/8fl oz, top up with the reserved liquid. Stir the citrus fruits and egg into the dried fruit mixture.

Sift the flour, baking powder, and salt together into another bowl. Stir into the dried fruit mixture until blended.

Transfer to the tin and bake until a skewer comes out clean, about 1 ½ hours. Leave in the tin for 10 mins before taking out.

GIVEN RECIPE

LEMON DRIZZLE CAKE

2 medium eggs

3oz (87.5g) self-raising flour

3oz (87.5g) caster sugar

3oz (87.5g) softened butter

¾ teaspoon baking powder

Finely grated zest of ½ lemon

Topping

2oz (50g) granulated sugar

Juice ½ lemon

1lb loaf tin greased and lined. Preheat oven to 180C/350F gas mark 4. Beat together the eggs, flour, caster sugar, butter, baking powder and lemon zest until smooth. Turn into prepared tin and bake in preheated oven for approx. 35mins until golden brown. (shrinking away from the sides of the tin and springy to touch). While the cake is warm, mix together the granulated sugar and lemon juice and pour over the warm cake. Leave to cool a little before removing from the tin.
