RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. A) All entries to be received by the Show Secretaries, The Old Chapel, Cury TR12 7BG no later than Wednesday, September 18th.

No late entries will be accepted on show day.

b) Entrance fee: Junior Classes free, all other classes 25p.

2. Exhibitors may enter as many exhibits as they wish but not more than three items per class.

3. Stewards cannot enter items in the section that they are stewarding.

4. All classes open to residents in Cornwall.

5. The Senior Steward reserves the right to refuse an entry.

6. Cards will be supplied by the Secretary from 8am on the morning of the show for the placing of exhibits.

7. Every exhibit must be staged by 9:45am and ready for judging by 10am at which time the hall will be cleared of all persons not officially engaged.

8. All trays, dishes, plates, vases, boxes etc for exhibiting flowers, vegetables etc to be provided by the exhibitor.

9. All exhibits shall be the recent bona-fide property of the exhibitors having not been previously entered and shall be grown, cultivated, taken or made by the exhibitor except floral art and pot plant classes.

10. The committee will take ordinary care of exhibits but will not be responsible for loss or damage. Moving or re-arranging the exhibits must be carried out by or under the jurisdiction of the Senior Steward.

11. Judges may withhold prizes if the specimens are not worthy and in all cases their decision will be final. If the entries in any class do not exceed three the judges will be at liberty to withhold any prize. Objections must be lodged with the Senior Steward before the presentation of the cups. Judges should use their discretion when judging, remembering the entries may come from inexperienced exhibitors.

12. No exhibit must be removed from the hall until after the presentation of all the prizes.

D18: GIVEN RECIPE: GLUTEN FREE VICTORIA SANDWICH

2 x 6" sandwich tins

Ingredients:

- 2 eggs
- Gluten free self raising flour
- Caster sugar
- Butter
- Tsp baking powder

Filling ingredients:

- Strawberry jam
- Icing sugar for dusting

Method:

Preheat oven to 180C conventional oven / fan oven 160C

- 1) Grease and line the base of the sandwich tins
- 2) Weigh and separate the eggs
- 3) Using the same weight as the eggs, weigh each of the ingredients: flour, sugar and butter
- 4) Place in bowls and add the egg yolks
- 5) Mix together until light and creamy
- 6) Whisk the egg whites until they form soft peaks
- 7) Fold the whisked egg whites into the creamed mixture
- 8) Divide the mixture evenly between the two sandwich tins
- 9) Bake on the centre shelf of the preheated oven for 20-25 minutes or until the cakes are golden in colour and spring back when touched
- 10) Turn out onto a cooling rack
- 11) When cold, spread jam onto one sponge and place second one on top
- 12) Sprinkle with a little icing sugar

D17: GIVEN RECIPE: CARROT CAKE

Ingredients:

- 200ml / 7fl oz sunflower oil
- 4 free range eggs
- 4 tbsp clear honey
- 225g / 8oz plain flour
- 2 tsp baking powder
- ½ tsp bicarbonate of soda
- pinch salt
- 1 tsp vanilla essence
- 175g / 6oz grated carrots
- Butter for greasing

For the icing:

- 75g / 2¼oz cream cheese
- 2 tbsp butter
- 340g / 12oz icing sugar, sifted
- 1 tsp vanilla essence

Method:

Preheat the oven to 180C / 350F / Gas 4

- 1) In a bowl, whisk together the oil, eggs and honey until well combined
- 2) Stir in the flour, baking powder, bicarbonate of soda, salt, vanilla essence and grated carrots and beat well
- 3) Pour the cake mixture into a greased 23cm / 9in cake tin and transfer to the oven to bake for one hour until a skewer poked into the centre comes out clean. Leave to cool on a wire rack and carefully remove from the tin when cool
- 4) For the icing, beat the cream cheese and butter together in a bowl until light and fluffy. Add the sifted icing sugar and vanilla essence and stir until combined
- 5) Once the cake is cool, using a palate knife, spread the icing across the cake. Serve in slices

13. A comments book will be at the show and any comments should be registered and signed before presentation of the cups.

14. Prize money: 1st 25p; 2nd 20p; 3rd 15p unless otherwise stated. All prize money to be claimed on the day of the show from the Show Secretaries.

15. Points awarded in all classes 1st 4 points, 2nd 2 points, 3rd 1 point.

16. All cups and trophies and shields to be returned to the Cup Steward, Andrew Stott, 2 Parknoweth, Cury, Churchtown, TR12 7BW by 1st August 2020. Any loss or damage to the cups, Mr Stott must be informed at once.

17. Small shields presented for best child's exhibit in each section do not need to be returned and may be kept.

18. Every child who enters the show will be presented with a certificate.
